

Greater Peterborough Health Investment Plan

Patient Audit Day (Formerly known as Point Prevalence)

Objectives

The Greater Peterborough Health Investment Plan has outlined a future model of intermediate care for the Outline Business Case.

This future model of care is based upon the following principles

- There should be a whole system approach to service provision;
- That care provision should be appropriate to need;
- There should be equity of access and service provision;
- Services should be “closer to home”;
- Services should cater for the needs of vulnerable people;
- Services should be efficient and of a high quality.

The project team and clinical core group have agreed to commission a piece of work in order to test the assumptions made in the outline business case that the integrated care centre and supporting domiciliary services will be able to deliver care based on the above principles, thereby reducing demand on the acute hospital and ensuring efficiency on bed utilisation

The Project

The trust with the support from the health planning advisors Secta will undertake a whole system study of bed occupancy across all in-patient beds. This study is to include beds at the following sites:

The survey will identify all patients in in-patient beds, who (in the case of an acute bed) no longer require acute care, or (in the case of rehabilitation, palliative or intermediate care bed) who could more appropriately be cared for in a domiciliary setting.

The focus will then be to help stakeholders define appropriate models of intermediate care based on current models of good practice, and to test the capacity and resources required to deliver these in terms of beds/ places associated with each option and where best to place these across the health economy.

Approach

Stage 1 Briefing session - Key stakeholders will form a steering group and attend a 1-hour briefing meeting.
